## Use icloud for windows to photos

iCloud You can access photos and videos stored in iCloud from a Windows computer using the iCloud app for Windows. There are three different features you can enable: iCloud photos, shared albums, and my photo stream. Each feature allows you to do different things. Before you start, find out what version of iCloud for Windows you have. Thank you for your comments. iCloud Photos securely stores all your photos and videos in iCloud, so they're available on all your devices. iCloud Photos uploads new photos and videos from your Windows PC so you can view them in the Photos app on your iPhone, iPad, iPod touch and Mac, and on iCloud.com. The new photos you take automatically download from iCloud Photos and you can choose to download your entire collection per year. You can upload your photos and videos from your PC to iCloud Photos when you follow these steps: whether you're using iCloud for Windows 10 or later: Open a File Explorer window. In the Navigation section, click on iCloud photos. In another window, open the folder where you currently store the photos you want to add to iCloud Photos. Select the photos you want to add. Slide them into the iCloud photo folder. If you use iCloud for Windows 7: Open a File Explorer window. Under Fast Access (favorites in Windows 7 and 8), click iCloud photos. Click Download photos and videos. Choose the photos and videos you want to download and click Open. You can see the photos and videos you've uploaded to the iCloud.com Photos app and to all your Apple devices. New photos and videos you add to iCloud Photos will be automatically uploaded to your PC. You can also download your collection per year, in iCloud for Windows 10 or earlier, when you follow these steps: on your Windows computer, open File Explorer (Windows 8 or later) or Windows Explorer (Windows 7). Click on iCloud photos in the Navigation section. If you don't see the iCloud photos, click Photos in the Navigation section, then double-click on iCloud Photos. If you use iCloud for Windows 11.1, click a thumbnail twice to download the file. If you use iCloud for Windows 10 or iCloud for Windows 7: new photos and videos you add to iCloud on another device are automatically downloaded to your PC. To upload older photos and videos to iCloud for Windows 10, click the notification area in the taskbar, then click Download Photos in the iCloud Photos notification. Choose the photos and videos you want to upload per year. In iCloud Windows 7, click Download Photos and Videos in the Windows Explorer toolbar. Choose the photos and videos you want to download per year, then click Download. Your photos and videos are uploaded to the location you set in the iCloud photo options. In iCloud for Windows 10 or later, if a photo or video is changed on another device or on iCloud.com, it is automatically updated on your PC. In iCloud for windows version 7, you need to re-download the photos to see all the updates. If you need help managing and using iCloud photos with your PC, you can find out more. Download iCloud for Windows to your PC. Restart your computer. Make sure iCloud for Windows is open. If it doesn't open automatically, go to Start, open apps or programs, and open iCloud for Windows. Enter your Apple ID to connect to iCloud. Choose the features and content you want to update on your devices. Click Apply. If you're not sure what Windows system you're using, find out. When you turn on photos, iCloud for Windows creates a Photos folder in File Explorer called iCloud Photos. iCloud Photos uploads new photos and videos that you add to the iCloud Photos folder on your PC so you can see them in the Photos app on your iPhone, iPad, iPod touch and Mac, and on iCloud.com. The new photos and videos you take automatically download from iCloud Photos. You can also share your photos. Shared Albums lets you view, share and comment on photos and videos you share with others. And if you use the latest version of iCloud for Windows, you can pin photos to keep them local to your device. When you delete your photos, they download to iCloud instead. On Windows 10: Open File Explorer. Click iCloud Photos from the Navigation section. Windows 8.1: Go to the home screen. Click the arrow down in the bottom left corner. Click on the iCloud photos app. Windows 8: Go to the home screen. Select iCloud photos. Windows 7: Click the Windows Start button, then click Photos. Click iCloud Photos or Photo Feed under the Favorites menu in the panel on the left. Double-click my photo feed to see your photos. This also appears as a folder in the window that appears. My photo stream is not available on iCloud for Windows 10 or later. When you turn on iCloud Drive, iCloud for Windows creates an iCloud Drive folder in File Explorer. You can find documents you've stored in iCloud in this folder. When you create a file on your PC and save it to the iCloud Drive folder, it also appears on your other devices. If want to work on files with friends or colleagues, you can share individual files or create a shared folder to share a group of files. You can also pin files and folders so you can use them offline, and easily check the status of a downloaded or shared file. You can also access your iCloud Drive files and folders at iCloud.com. If you receive an error when you try to move an iCloud file to Windows, you may need to download the file to your Windows PC. After you the file, try to move it again. To keep your mail, contacts, calendars and tasks up to date on your devices, make sure iCloud is set up on your PC, iPhone, iPad, iPod touch or Mac using the steps below. If you connect to iCloud using a third-party Mail app outside of iCloud for Windows, learn how to create an app-specific password. On your PC: Open iCloud for Windows. Select Mail, Contacts, Calendars and Tasks and then click Apply. You'll see your iCloud Mail account in the folder section on the left side of Microsoft Outlook 2007 via Outlook 2016. On your iPhone, iPad or iPod touch: Tap Settings [your name], then select iCloud. Turn on mail, contacts, calendars and reminders. On your Mac: Choose the Apple menu  system preferences, then click Apple ID. Click iCloud, then select Mail, Contacts, Calendars and Reminders. On a Mac or iOS device, you see reminders instead of tasks. To see your iCloud storage available, open iCloud for Windows. To manage your storage, click Storage. Select an app to see how much storage you use, or click Buy More Storage to upgrade your storage plan. If you use iCloud for Windows 10 or later, you can pin files to keep them local to your device. When you delete your photos, they download to iCloud instead. If you want to make changes to your Apple ID, including updating your email, mailing address or other account information, open iCloud for Windows and click on account details. Click Manage Apple ID. In iCloud for Windows 10 or later: visit the Microsoft Store to check for software updates. In previous versions of iCloud for Windows: To check for updates, open the Apple software update on your PC. To be notified when an update is available through Apple Software Update, choose Change the preferences of 'gt' and select when you want to check for updates. You can choose daily, weekly, monthly or never. If you turn off a service in iCloud for Windows, your information won't automatically stay up to date in iCloud, and you won't see updates on your other devices. Follow these steps to disable a service or iCloud: To disable a service on your PC, open iCloud for Windows, and then select or deselect that service. To save your changes, click Apply. To disable iCloud for Windows, open iCloud for Windows, then opt out. If you want to uninstall iCloud for Windows, be sure to make a copy of your iCloud data and on your PC. Then dedicate yourself to iCloud for Windows on your PC, and follow these steps: Windows 8 or later: go to the home screen, click right in the bottom left corner or click, then select Control Panel. Click Uninstall a program. Click on iCloud - Uninstall. When asked to confirm, select Yes. Windows 7: Choose the Start-control menu. Click on Programs and features. Select iCloud - Uninstall.
